2.3 Other hazards:	
Inhalation:	can cause respiratory irritation, dizziness, and central nervous system depression, potentially leading to headaches, nausea, and dizziness.
Ingestion:	can cause nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, and potentially lead to central nervous system depression and other toxic effects.

Skin Contact:	can cause irritation, redness, and dryness, and prolonged exposure may lead to more severe skin damage.

4.1 Description of first aid measures	
General information:	
After inhalation:	If breathed in, move person into fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. Consult a physician.

4.2 Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed:	The most important symptoms include respiratory irritation, dizziness, nausea, vomiting, skin and eye irritation, and in severe cases, central nervous system depression, liver or kidney damage, and long-term respiratory issues.
