2.3 Other hazards:	
Inhalation:	can cause dizziness, headache, respiratory irritation, and central nervous system depression.
Ingestion:	can cause nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, and may lead to central nervous system depression or aspiration into the lungs, which can be fatal.
Skin Contact:	may cause irritation, dryness, or defatting of the skin with prolonged or repeated exposure.
Eye contact:	can cause irritation, redness, and watering of the eyes.
Chronic Exposure:	may lead to liver and kidney damage, central nervous system effects, and increased risk of developing chemical sensitivity or dermatitis.
Aggravation of pre-existing conditions:	may aggravate pre-existing conditions such as skin disorders, respiratory diseases (e.g., asthma or bronchitis), and eye conditions due to its irritating and sensitizing effects.

4.1 Description of first aid measures	
General information:	
After inhalation:	If breathed in, move person into fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. Consult a physician.
After skin contact:	Remove contaminated clothing immediately. Wash with plenty of water. Consult a physician.
After eye contact:	Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. consult a physician.

4.2 Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed:	may cause dizziness, headache, nausea, respiratory and skin irritation acutely, with delayed effects including central nervous system depression, liver and kidney damage, and dermatitis.
4.3 Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed:	Treat symptomatically.

6.3 Methods and material for containment and cleaning up:	Take up spill into absorbent material, e.g.: sand, earth, vermiculite, powdered limestone. Scoop absorbed substance into closing containers. Spill must not return in its original container. Clean contaminated surfaces with an excess of water. Wash clothing and equipment after handling.
